





Reasons for absenteeism



Health-related reasons

- Health-related reasons
 - "The absences in our school are mainly caused by abdominal pains and migraines, and they cause hundreds of hours of absences, and then how to tackle them—that is truly quite a problem." (principle)

- Health-related reasons
- Undiagnosed learning difficulties
 - "Or then there is some hidden, like, learning difficulty, which might not manifest until middle school, so that in elementary school they still manage but then in junior high school some learning related challenge or difficulty is discovered." (social worker)

- Health-related reasons
- Undiagnosed learning difficulties
- Reasons related to leisure time

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- Heritability
- Insufficient parenting
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 - "... a few of these asocial, careless families where they don't monitor a whole lot whether the child attends school or not." (school doctor)
- Changes within the family
- Travel
 - "Increasingly, students travel around the globe; that is one impacting factor." (school nurse)

School-related reasons

- Relationships in school
- Electronic student management systems
 - "There are also cases where the students themselves have had the guardian's login details to [the electronic student management system], and this way they have signed off on [the absences]." (teacher)

Medical expertise

- Medical expertise
- Confidentiality, acceptability, natural authority
 - "So if you work as a full-time school doctor, this is everyday life. Absences are a part of the everyday. They are a part of the job. I think that it's one of the most important aspects of the job." (school doctor)

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- School doctors' views

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 - Part of the job description
 - Benefits from health check-ups
 - Own entity

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- School nurse; a good partner to everyone

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- Resources?
 - "As I listen to everyone here I get the feeling [that people are saying] that 'let's burden the nurse more', all the time, more, more, and more, so that you should be a psychiatric nurse and an acute care specialist and, in a way, the whole package, and at the same time manage the entire social side, to give advice on who to contact and when it's needed." (school nurse)

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- Interest, efficiency, unfamiliarity

Tendency to change

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- Opinion on co-operation difficulties

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- Legislative changes

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 - Society-related reasons
- Theoretical support on the inclusion of school health care
 - School doctors' motivation
 - Best accomplished when school health care is present at the school
- Difficulties in co-operation
 - Basis for policy changes?
