

- Primary education
- Secondary Education: Praktijkonderwijs, VMBO, HAVO en VWO
- Tertiary education
 - Vocational education (MBO)
 - Hogeschool (HBO)
 - University





National collaboration: Thuiszittersoverleg

2016: Thuiszitterspact

Commitment: No child stays at home for longer than 3 months without perspective on school attendance and/or a youth care plan

Regional approach

- Reduction of numbers of non-attenders/ children with chronic and severe absenteeism
- Prevention of dropout
- Collaboration between education and youth care
- Tailor-made education
- Providing a perspective on school attendance with the proper support
- Reducing exemptions compulsory education

2020: goals have not been achieved






Working elements

- Urgency is felt on both national and regional level
- Commitment to goals to reduce number of non-attenders
- Shared definition of non-attenders
- Improved registration of absenteeism

Challenges

- Limited definition of non-attenders (thuiszitters)
- Complexity and diversity of educational needs
- Complex and segregated educational system
- Collaboration youth care and education
- Different interests




National policy - Lines of action

- 1. Every child in the picture
 - Registration of all absenteeism
 - Analyse absenteeism data
- 2. Appropriate education for every student
 - Educational interventions
- 3. Utilizing distance learning for children and youths who are not attending school
